English Heritage has completed a refurbishing of the house and restored the surrounding buildings. The house still has the romantic character of a Victorian historical novel, including the priest hole in the attic where Charles is said to have spent the night.

But one of the most special attractions at Boscobel lies in the fields beyond the garden, the Royal Oak Tree!

## MOSELEY OLD HALL. THE HOUSE THAT SAVED A KING...

This romantic and exciting story continues when you visit Moseley Old Hall. Upon leaving Boscobel House, the young King Charles II fled to Moseley Old Hall. Now managed by The National Trust, you can enter the house through the same door King Charles used in 1651, see the bed on which he slept and the priest hole in which he hid from Cromwell's soldiers.

After exploring the house you may wander around the impressive knot garden that is based upon a 1640 design.

The perfect setting to relax and enjoy the wonderful atmosphere of Moseley Old Hall.

- Choose from either a full, guided tour of the property (Wednesdays Only) or a Talk on 17th Century 'Cures' or 'Food' and a tour of the property (Thursdays Only).
- Enjoy afternoon tea and home made cakes in Moseley's 18th century coach house. There is also an opportunity for you to purchase souvenirs, gifts and books from Moseley's well-stocked gift shop before your journey home.
