On the single-storey extension to the left, when viewed from the road, there is a protruding half-hexagonal window. Originally this was a turnpike toll house, and retention of the window mentioned above is essential. The Royal Oak has been a public house for at least 200 years; it is referred to as such in a sale of 1802 when it was bought by Thomas Bowen, a malster, who added a second storey to the single-storey outbuildings at the rear to create a malthouse. It formed part of the Blakelands Estate, from which it was sold in 1919, forming Lot 4, which was described as being 'let to the Wolverhampton Brewery Company at the low rent of £59 9s', and as being a house with 'a good reputation, capable of doing a large trade'; its features including a bar, tap-room, club room, shop, pantry kitchen with range, brewhouse, range and boiler, private sitting room and six bedrooms'. In 1924 the pub was sold to Banks's Brewery.

The cost is considerable too, but it has been carried out by Mr. Whitehead, the engineer to the Rural Council at a fair estimate. The work has been done well by the contractor, and the apparatus for dealing with the sewage is of the latest type. It is gratifying to the progressive folk of Cheslyn Hay that it is so and that work about which there has been so much discussion has been completed. The following is a description of the works:-</p> <p>These works have been designed to deal with the sewage from the whole township of Cheslyn Hay. It was found quite impracticable to bring all the sewers to one outfall, and after much negotiation two sites were eventually secured, the one near the Saredon Road, and the other near the Staffordshire and Worcestershire Canal Company's reservoir at Littlewood. The scheme has consequently been divided into two portions which for convenience have been called 'Saredon Road Scheme' and 'Littlewood Scheme'. The Littlewood Scheme is calculated to deal with the sewage from a population of 2,750 and the Saredon Road Scheme from a population of 1,100. These figures are in excess of</p>
