## Could you Be our Eyes and Ears

During the summer months the number of woodland / grass fires that we respond to vastly increases as more people start to venture out. Staffordshire Fire and Rescue Service would like to do our best in ensuring that our community can enjoy our open spaces but also that you enjoy them safely.

#### WE NEED YOUR HELP

We would like to ask anyone that is already enjoying and visiting our outdoor spaces to be our eyes and ears.

Your local community safety officers currently undertake patrols in our hot spot areas but as you may appreciate, can not be everywhere at once.

Therefore, should you observe any of the following whilst you are out and visiting our woodland/grassland heath areas then we would ask that you let your local Community Safety Officer know providing details of what you have observed and exact location:-

- Evidence of a camp fire or BBQ
- Evidence of the disposal of alcohol
- Evidence of the disposal of smoking materials
- Evidence of burnt or scorched material
- Evidence of flytipping

Please note there is a complete ban in the use of BBQ/Naked Flames on Cannock Chase AONB
